

Maintenance of Historical Site Takamatsu Castle:



■ Dismantling and Restoration of the Stone Walls

In addition to being a nationally designated historic site, the castle components such as the Tsukimi Yagura (Moon-Viewing Tower), the Watari Yagura (Connecting Gallery), the Mizute Gomon (Waterside Gate), the Ushitora Yagura (Northeast Tower), as well as the Hiunkaku, a villa of the Takamatsu Matsudaira family built in the Taisho period (1912-1926), have been designated as National Important Cultural Properties and the Hiunkaku Garden has been designated as a National Place of Scenic Beauty, and efforts are being made to preserve and utilize them. As conservation measures, we have worked on dismantling and repairing the stone walls as well as providing earthquake reinforcement for the Hiunkaku, to hand down the cultural assets to the future. As for utilization measures, we are developing facilities that allow visitors to experience the castle's former landscape, such as restoring the Sakura Gomon (Cherry Gate).
